







DISCOVERING COCONUT GROVE: HISTORIC, CHARMING, & SERENE

Coconut Grove's lush waterfront parks and marinas combine to create a classic South Florida lifestyle, where it's easy to spend days at leisure in the region's tropical climate. From sunset sailing and tennis to biking or running along miles of trails and pathways, Coconut Grove is a place for people who love to embrace the outdoors.

Locals and visitors also enjoy a vibrant cultural and culinary scene that encompasses everything from private galleries to a year-round calendar of festivals and events in celebration of art, food, and music.



With ancient trees and verdant parks, the heart of Coconut Grove is a picturesque place to spend time catching up with friends over brunch, sip cappuccino at an outdoor café, or drift in and out of shops.



Miami's original neighborhood was founded in 1873 by an eclectic mix of pioneers, artists, intellectuals, and adventurers. The tropical oasis of Coconut Grove is an escape from the stresses of city life. Coconut Grove is located in the middle of Miami, yet completely separate and quaint. The Grove offers a warm, laid-back atmosphere with charming boutiques, galleries, gourmet restaurants, sidewalk cafés, and sailboats anchored in Biscayne Bay. The neighborhood's distinctive Bohemian flair and lush tropical canopy make it a favorite with locals and visitors alike.

Coconut Grove is synonymous with natural beauty, artistic traditions, and cosmopolitan sensibilities. Beautiful gardens, tree-filled parks, serene boardwalks, and lively waterfronts, set the Grove apart from surrounding communities. Trees so ancient that indigenous people may have walked among them, continue to flourish here, as do flamboyant Royal Poincianas and other native species. Coconut Grove's waterfront green spaces include Regatta Park, Peacock Park, The Barnacle Historic State Park, David T. Kennedy Park, and the Kampong, a nine-acre botanical garden set on the former estate of famed explorer David Fairchild.

NATURE, PARKS & GARDENS



Alice Wainwright Park

A popular spot for family gatherings and pickup basketball games, this bayfront park is named for environmentalist Alice Cutts Wainwright, who was the first woman elected to the Miami City Commission. Located off a tree-lined avenue that runs near Vizcaya and Key Biscayne, the park includes a playground, an outdoor gym, and ample picnic areas.

The Barnacle Historic State Park

The park preserves Miami's native landscape and the 1891 home and workshop of yacht designer and Grove pioneer Ralph Middleton Munroe. Cross the tropical hardwood hammock to discover lawns sloping toward Biscayne Bay. Moonlight concerts make for romantic evenings here, and an afternoon break on the historic home's front porch takes visitors back to another century.

David T. Kennedy Park

A rubber jogging path snakes through this nearly 30-acre park, and along the way it hugs a dog park, an outdoor gym, beach-volleyball courts, Biscayne Bay, mangroves, and towering, leafy trees that provide ample shade for the many people who come here to picnic, read, or simply chill. The park is also home to the A.C.'s Icees frozen-lemonade truck, which has been serving parkgoers for more than 40 years.

The Kampong

One of only five sites recognized by the National Tropical Botanical Garden organization, and the only one of those sites not to be located in Hawaii, the verdant, nine-acre Kampong was once home to globetrotting botanist David Fairchild (1869-1954). Credited with bringing some 200,000 plants and crops to the United States, Fairchild continues to be celebrated at the Kampong, which today operates as an educational and research facility in addition to hosting weddings, tour groups, yoga classes, and private events. Many of the once-exotic species Fairchild introduced to the property can still be found here, including kaffir orange, plumeria, and starfruit trees.



Peacock Park

Named for Charles and Isabella Peacock, who built South Florida's first hotel on the site in the early 1880s, this 9.4-acre park includes family-friendly recreational facilities and a boardwalk bridge with bay views. Edged by mangroves and palms, and shaded by stately oaks and other old-growth trees, the park is a popular gathering place and venue for community events.

Regatta Park

Opened in 2015, Regatta Park lies between Peacock and Kennedy parks, forming a key link in Coconut Grove's waterfront master plan. Home to 1,000 trees and palms, its broad center lawn and grove of shade trees serve as a staging area for sailboat regattas in the winter months. Butterfly gardens, a playground, a promenade, and a tree allée figure in this 17-acre oasis.





Vizcaya Museum and Gardens

Located on the northern end of Coconut Grove on Biscayne Bay, Vizcaya was the winter estate of manufacturing magnate James Deering, who spent the years between 1912 and 1922 constructing the building and furnishing it with antiquities and artifacts, particularly from Italy. Today, the site is open to the public for guided tours of the house and gardens, which include a stunning collection of native and exotic flora. Gray foxes live on and around the property, so keep your eyes open for them.



Vizcaya Museum and Gardens



In Miami's early days, most commercial transportation took place on the water. Automobiles were rare, and roads were primitive. While times have changed, the waters off Coconut Grove continue to be well-trafficked, with residents and tourists relaxing, working, and playing on Biscayne Bay. No matter the reason, a number of Grove marinas accommodate amateur and professional boaters, and the bay plays host to some of the world's most important regattas.

This club has been around since 1887 and today hosts a number of regattas, including the Etchells Biscayne Bay Series, the Orange Bowl International, and the Lime Cup Ocean Race.

Founded in 1955, this club's year-round sailing and motorboating events include the Columbus Day Regatta, the Bacardi Cup Star Class, the Orange Bowl International Youth Regatta, and the World Cup Series USA Miami. The club also hosts fishing tournaments.

Dinner Key Marina

The City of Miami calls Dinner Key its "flagship facility," as it houses not just City Hall but fishing charters, a 582-slip marina—the state's largest, the city says—and a fascinating history. Pan American Airlines housed its flying boats, aka seaplanes, on the site in the 1930s and '40s, and in the run-up to World War II, a military school trained aerial navigators. Today, a 225-vessel mooring facility sits nearby.

Grove Harbour Marina offers concierge services and marina amenities for vessels up to 150 feet. Floating docks provide 58 slips with six-foot dock depths.

Prime Marina Miami

Part of a national chain of marinas, Prime Marina Miami features 114 wet slips, fishing and scuba charters, and full marine services. It can dock boats up to 100 feet, and the facility is a short walk from a Starbucks and Monty's, a 50-year-old waterfront raw bar.

This nonprofit organization, founded in 1990, provides disabled children and adults with social, healthy, and confidence-building adventures on the water. Operating out of a former Coast Guard hangar on Biscayne Bay, Shake-A-Leg maintains more than 80 boats and kayaks, and offers a program for disabled veterans and summer camps for kids.

Coconut Grove is home to several first-rate private schools that educate children from pre-K through high school graduation. Some of these schools date back to the mid-20th century, and all leave their students well prepared for lives and careers in the modern world.

Elementary classes here serve kids ages 6 to 11, and the school's special programs include courses in world languages, robotics, yoga, and music. Toddlers from 18 months to 3 years old are eligible for half- or full-day sessions, and classrooms are led by a teacher and at least one assistant. The toddler program's curriculum includes second-language instruction, independent and group work, and toilet training. The school is accredited by the Florida Kindergarten Council and is a member of the American Montessori Society.

A New CocoWalk Joins the Neighborhood

Once Coconut Grove's most recognizable tourist magnet, with chain restaurants such as The Cheesecake Factory and Chili's exemplifying the open-air mall's humdrum vibe, CocoWalk has been made over with locals in mind. Following a major reconstruction project that saw much of the old structure demolished, the site is now a mixed-use facility with retail shops and restaurants sharing space with a public plaza and a private, five-story office building called One Cocowalk. The upscale Cinépolis movie theater remains a CocoWalk anchor, and the restaurants—including Los Generales Mezcal & Grill, helmed by Top Chef Mexico star Aquiles Chávez—are a far cry from the days of Famous Factory Meatloaf and Big Mouth Burgers.


